The investment strategy is to seek to maximize risk-adjusted returns by investing in primarily first lien, senior secured, floating rate bank loans of non-investment grade (i.e., high yield) companies. The Shenkman Capital Floating Rate High Income Fund employs a conservative approach which focuses on principal preservation. Portfolios are well diversified across issue, issuer, and industry.

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The leveraged loan market, as measured by the Morningstar LSTA US Leveraged Loan Index (the "Index"), returned 1.53% in May. High coupons and robust collateralized loan obligation (CLO) formations provided tailwinds for the asset class during the month despite the turbulence in the equity markets as investors digest a rapid flow of policy changes from the new Administration. For context, high yield bonds, investment grade bonds, and U.S. Treasuries, as measured by the ICE BofA US High Yield Index (HOAO), ICE BofA Corporate Index (COAO), and ICE BofA Current 10-year Treasury Index (GA10), posted monthly returns of 1.68%, 0.00%, and -1.41%, respectively.

Returns by rating showed a quality bias in favor of lower-rated loans in May as BB and B rated loans returned 1.39% and 1.57%, respectively, while CCC & below rated loans returned 3.04%. Liquid loans, as measured by the Morningstar LSTA US Leveraged Loan 100 Index, performed largely in-line with the Index in May with a return of 1.52%. The top performing industries in the Index included Personal Care Products, Automobiles, and Household Products, while the performance laggards included Construction & Engineering, Distributors, and Building Products. All 62 industries in the Index showed a positive return in May.

Primary leveraged loan market activity rebounded in May with \$31.5 billion coming to market following tepid April issuance of \$6.2 billion. The use of proceeds continues to be dominated by refinancing and repricing activity, which represented over 77% of issuance year-to-date (29.1% and 48.8%, respectively). From a demand standpoint, gross CLO formations also rebounded in May as gross CLO volume totaled \$33.4 billion (\$19.4 billion net of reset/refinancing), a 32% increase over the prior month. Seven loan issuers defaulted in May impacting \$2.9 billion in loans following three issuer defaults in the prior month affecting \$2.4 billion are value. As a result, the J.P. Morgan 12-month par-weighted leveraged loan default rate increased 19 bps to 1.42%, remaining below the historical average default rate of approximately 3%. While traditional defaults, defined as a missed interest payment or bankruptcy, have been on the decline, distressed exchanges and liability management exercises (LMEs) have significantly increased. Including distressed exchanges, the default rate ended May at 3.62%.

President Trump's tariff waffling seemed to leave investors with the impression that the end result is likely to be less severe than originally anticipated, which appeared to buoy sentiment during the month. We believe the focus on a macro-basis is likely to remain on policy pronouncements in the coming months while keeping a close eye on inflation and Fed actions.

We continue to monitor developments across industries and the broader economy, seeking to assess the potential impact on the leveraged loan market. Given the current attractive all-in credit spreads, we believe the leveraged loan market presents compelling relative value opportunities, particularly with the high current base rates. As we seek to proactively manage the portfolio and trade exposures across our global platform, our goal remains to safeguard against potential downside risks while concurrently optimizing returns.
